# WA STATE LEGISLATIVE SESSION CONTINUES!

By the time this article is in your kid's backpack crumpled under, what is that? A banana peel? Focus Day and the week of advocacy will be complete but if you missed it, don't worry! There is still time to weigh in on important issues as the legislative session doesn't end until the end of this month.

The Washington State PTA Legislative Committee has done an amazing job making concrete recommendations on each of the state's PTA legislative priorities. Which are:

- WSPTA Top 5 Priorities: Social Emotional Learning, Amply Fund Basic Education, Closing the Opportunity Gap, Standards for Paraeducators, and Breakfast After the Bell
- WSPTA also supporting: Addressing the Teacher Shortage, Best Practices for School Meal Policies, Career Connected Learning, CTE & Stem, Dual Credit Equality & Support, Engaging Families in Student Success, Equity for Highly Capable, Improving Educational Outcomes for Foster Children, Post-Secondary/Higher Education Access and Affordability, Preventing and Mitigating the Impacts of Gender-based Violence, Removing Barriers to Implementing ECEAP (Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program), Restorative Justice and School Safety, and School Construction and Class Size Reduction
