LETTER FROM THE PTA PRESIDENT

We sent our staff into holiday break with a Staff Appreciation Luncheon led by **Mel Spiker**. The spread looked delicious, a wonderful representation of the way we feel about our hard-working staff. Thank you Mel and all those who brought in food, we really appreciate your efforts. Also, every single item on the Giving Garland wishlist was fulfilled. I love the way this community rallies!

Now it's time to dig in and get back into the routine! Our kids will be hearing about grit and goals this month. Report cards went home right before the break, which gives our students a chance to gauge where they're at. They now have everything they need to know to reach their goals by the end of the year. One of my personal mottos is "No failure, only feedback!"

Speaking of goals, how are we doing? Your PTA board? We're moving into the most important and impactful period in the PTA experience - approving the budget. I'm not a numbers person, and before I went through the process myself I wouldn't have paid a moment's notice to the budget. But after sitting on the Budget Committee last year, and then spending the first half of the year executing on that approved budget I now see community involvement in the budget process as the MOST IMPORTANT thing you can do for your child within the scope of the PTA. During these discussions we talk about whether to fund the counselor, if kids will get to Camp Burton again, should we keep the Writers in the Schools program, how much can we give for ELA supplies next year, and so much more. These decisions play a major role in your child's experience from year-to-year, and we can't make the best decision for the broadest range of kids if we don't have a variety of voices telling us what they want to see from the PTA next year.

This year we'll be approving the budget in March, moving the usual timeline up by several months. The PTA meetings on February 6th and March 7th will be when discussions (2/6) and approval (3/7) take place. Please join us and help us craft the best 2019-2020 PTA experience possible.

Welcome to 2019, Let the WA State Legislative Session Begin!

On January 14, 2019 the Washington State Legislative session will kick off. This is a long session and a budget year so lawmakers will head back to Olympia to determine the state budget and what and how things will be paid for. There are many things to pay attention to and ways to get involved.

Our State Legislative Representatives

Article IX, Section I of the Washington State Constitution reads: "It is the paramount duty of the state to make ample provision for the education of all children residing within its borders, without distinction or preference on account of race, color, caste, or sex."

In other words, it is the duty of the state to provide access to education. What that exactly means, what should be included, and how to pay for it is all the job of the legislature to define. YOU can help make important changes in our educational system by letting your voices be heard.

Things to be on the lookout for during this Legislative session:

Social and Emotional Learning in Education

As you know Alki PTA is supporting our need for a school counselor by paying for the position salary. This is unsustainable and we may not be able to continue to fund the position. We need to continue to advocate both at the state level and at the

Seattle Public Schools District level for counselors to be included in the baseline for ALL Washington Schools. PTAs should not have to pay for this vital school resource or go without.

Funding for Education (still)

Last year the Legislature created an overhaul to how public schools are funded and made some headway in education funding. Unfortunately, because of levy restrictions the law imposed, some districts, like Seattle will actually be receiving less money in the next school year. Without additional funding, resources like counselors will remain underfunded and unavailable.


FOR 2019-20 YEAR
