January - February: Principal Budget Chats to engage in discussions with parents and hear feedback. View dates/times at <u>bit.ly/budgetchat2020</u>

January - March: Staff meet and discuss needs and programs.

February 5, 2020: Budget Committee presentation (work-inprocess) at General PTA Meeting and minimum grant vote by membership (i.e. \$115K to the school).

March: School grants reviewed in detail and proposed by Principal Deese and Building Leadership Team ("BLT"). The PTA school grant funds are combined with the funds received from SPS. Principal Deese and the BLT will propose the spending allocations based on this total combined income. Their process included receiving feedback from staff, students, and parents as well as looking into other funding options (grants).

March or April: PTA Budget Committee presentation of proposed PTA budget and discussion/ vote by membership.

Seattle School Board Adopts the Annual Black Lives Matter at School Week Resolution

Black History Month School Assembly Thursday, February 27 8:00 AM

At the regular board meeting on Wednesday, January 22, 2020, the Seattle School Board unanimously adopted Resolution No. 2019/20-23 to declare that the lives of Black students matter and to encourage districtwide participation in the national Black Lives Matter at School Week movement

from February 3 - 7, 2020. This annual resolution affirms the Seattle School Board's commitment to racial justice and recognition that the lives and lived experiences of our Black youth matter, not just during Black History Month, but every single day.

Throughout our nation's history, systems of oppression and injustice have led to deepening racial disparities and racism across all sectors of society and have lasting negative consequences for our communities, cities, and nation. The Board also recognizes that the killing of unarmed Black men and women, including queer and transgender persons of color, has left young people and our communities searching for answers to incredibly complicated issues of race, justice, and fairness.

Public education systems and educators have an important role to play in disrupting legacies of racism. Declaring "Black Lives Matter at School" affirms our commitment to all of our students and elevates Black students' stories, strengths, and struggles - publicly demonstrating our intentional work to create a more just and loving society.

This is the third consecutive year that the Seattle School Board has declared that the lives of Black students matter and encouraged districtwide participation in the national Black Lives Matter at School Week movement. This week is recognized nationwide as an opportunity to promote racial justice and identity safety in classrooms, and Seattle Public Schools is proud to be a part of this important work made possible by our educators and the Seattle Education Association. The SPS Ethnic Studies Advisory Group, with support from SEA's Center for Racial Equity, has been working tirelessly to prepare resources, lessons, and supports to celebrate and affirm the lives of our students.

What is Process Art?

Supporting Access to the Arts | School of Excellence

Process Art is art that is child-directed, choice-driven, and celebrates the experience of discovery. In process art, the final product is always unique and the focus lies in the creation of the work, not the outcome. There are so many benefits to process art! Process art is developmentally appropriate for young children because it meets them where they are as sensory explorers.



Through process art, children...

- •will think creatively, independently, and imaginatively
- •will learn about the physical limitations and possibilities of materials.
- •will gain confidence to realize their own ideas.
- •will embrace experimentation and mistakes as part of the learning process.

Why do adults love process art?

Parents usually find process art easier to do than product-focussed art projects. Process-focussed projects don't require a lot of fancy set up or unique materials that are hard to come by. This saves both time and money. The goal of process art is to explore and discover, rather than achieve perfection. Adults are emotionally free to support whatever the child dreams up as an ideal solution or end result. No fighting, tears, or half-completed projects.

During the session we'll be walking through what Common Core Standards mean for you and your child through a house party or community discussion format. Guided activities and discussions will revolve around the following:

We will also view a short video and learn how to make the most of parent teacher conferences by asking core-specific questions that will help facilitate discussions about your child's current academic performance.


There is no magic unique age when all kids are ready for a device of their own... here are a few things to keep in mind:


